

Thousands Of Msambweni Residents Benefit From A Free Medical Camp Hosted By Safaricom Foundation

In yet another show of its commitment towards transforming lives, Safaricom foundation in partnership with the Kenya Diabetes Management and Information Center has hosted a one day free medical camp in Msambweni.

The camp attracted close to 3,000 residents who turned up at the Jomo Kenyatta Primary School to access free diagnosis and treatment for various ailments.

“This turnout just goes to show that there is immense need of health care in this community,” said Josephine Kamanthe, Safaricom Foundation Trustee.

She emphasised the need for more Public-Private partnerships to uplift communities and for the ultimate development of the country.

DMI Executive Director Eva Muchemi said: “Through these medical camps, we not only offer free treatment for all kinds of ailments but also raise awareness on diabetes as well as offer screening and treatment to patients.”

The Msambweni medical camp is the 19th in the fourth phase that will have 20 free medical camps across the country and two children camps.

Since inception, Safaricom Foundation has funded over 50 medical camps across the country with more than 100,000 Kenyans benefitting and 1000 cases followed to hospital level.
